

## Proposed University Senate Resolution Honoring Don McCabe

Whereas Donald L. McCabe, Professor Emeritus of Management and global Business at Rutgers University, has established a national and international reputation for his pioneering work in academic integrity;

Whereas over the past two decades he has conducted extensive studies of issues of academic integrity among high school and college students and just completed a major study in the United States and Canada, having already surveyed over 250,000 college students , 20,000 faculty member, and 5,000 high school students, thereby providing an exhaustive and nuanced examination of the evolution of academic integrity issues and making them more visible and intelligible to the university community and to the general public via public lectures, interviews, and media appearances as well;

Whereas he has shared his scholarship on academic integrity with institutions and audiences on five continents;

Whereas he had provided exemplary service to Rutgers University, serving a term as Associate Provost of Rutgers-Newark and as chair of the University-wide committee that substantially revised Rutgers' Code of Student Conduct;

Whereas he is the founding president of The Center for Academic Integrity at Clemson University, a consortium of over 300 schools who have joined together in a common effort to identify and promote more effective strategies for promoting student integrity and was Vice Chair of the then Organization Management for three semesters and served one as Acting Chair and was Director of the Executive MBA Program for two years,

Whereas the Rutgers Business School in 2014 established the Donald L. McCabe Academic Integrity Award to be given annually to a student, faculty or staff member who promotes the values of academic integrity at Rutgers Business School and named Don McCabe its first awardee "in recognition of his commitment to promoting the values of academic integrity at Rutgers Business School and throughout the world,

We hereby express our deepest gratitude and appreciation for Don McCabe's service in promoting academic integrity not only at Rutgers but nationally and internationally as well and wish him much success in his continued efforts in that field and a joyous and fulfilling retirement from Rutgers.
