

Text of President McCormick's March 25, 2009 Response to the [April 2005 Senate Report and Recommendations on Charge S-0314, Faculty Role in Undergraduate Admissions and Recruitment](#):

I am writing in response to the Report and Recommendations on Charge S-0314 related to the faculty role in undergraduate admissions and recruitment, as adopted by the University Senate in April, 2005. I am grateful to the members of the Senate Academic Standards, Regulations, and Admissions Committee for their report and recommendations in this area.

Since the issuance of this report, and the adoption of *Transforming Undergraduate Education: Report of the Task Force on Undergraduate Education* in 2006, faculty involvement in undergraduate admissions and recruitment has increased substantially. Vice President for Enrollment Management Courtney McAnuff reports strong faculty input into the undergraduate admissions process, including several faculty committees that review admissions guidelines, processes, and goals. In addition, a faculty member sits on all enrollment council meetings. Lastly, admissions staff meet with the deans and faculty from each of the units on all three campuses several times a year to establish admissions guidelines, scholarship criteria, and enrollment projections.
