**Response to University Senate Charge
S-2110: Research Information Systems**

Introduction

In response to the University Senate charge S-2110, the Office for Research and the Rutgers University Libraries formed a temporary task force chaired by Dr. Michael Zwick, Rutgers Senior Vice President for Research, and Consuella Askew, Vice President for University Libraries and University Librarian.

The task force met to review the current Research Information Systems (RISs) and make a recommendation on a universitywide RIS.

Research Information System Recommendation

The university currently employs two RISs for different purposes: Exploro and Research with Rutgers. Both have advantages and limitations. The summary produced for these two RISs is attached.

In collaboration with the RGPEC, the task force has decided to adopt Research with Rutgers for several reasons:

1. Research with Rutgers is a collaboration with the Commission on Science Innovation and Technology, and the State of New Jersey funds licenses for STEM faculty.
2. Research with Rutgers is part of Research with New Jersey, a collaboration with other New Jersey Institutions, including Rowan University, Princeton University, NJIT, and Montclair State University.
3. Research with Rutgers meets most criteria needed to satisfy Senate recommendations 1 and 2.
4. Research with Rutgers includes key information such as
 - a. Core facilities
 - b. Searchable researcher database with expertise and equipment.
 - c. Information about grant awards to RU researchers

- d. Information about publications from RU researchers
- e. Integration with RU data in public databases (e.g. PubMed, ORCID)

The Office for Research also manages social media to extend the reach of Rutgers Research and Rutgers Innovation.

The Office for Research is also pursuing other initiatives with its central and Chancellor-led unit counterparts, including a research data task force. This task force will develop policies and best practices for handling and storing research data.

Next Steps

To expand Research with Rutgers to all tenured, tenure track, and non-tenure track full-time faculty, the Office for Research is asking for funding to support the license cost and 2 full-time professional staff to provide training and support for faculty. While basic support is currently offered for STEM faculty, adding additional faculty and taking full advantage of Research with Rutgers will require additional financial support.

The Office for Research will make this proposal as part of their FY 26 budget request, which, if approved, will begin on July 1, 2025.
