## Resolution on the Rejection of the Federal Government's "Compact for Excellence in Higher Education" Offered to all American Colleges and Universities on October 13, 2025

WHEREAS the "Compact for Excellence in Higher Education" offers colleges and universities preferential consideration for federal funding in exchange for significant concessions in academic freedom, institutional integrity, and autonomous decision-making that will cede control over these areas to the federal government; and

WHEREAS Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, is a major, leading public institution of higher education that has supported independent scholarly inquiry along with other mission-critical educational and service activities since its founding in 1766; and

WHEREAS the Rutgers University Senate is comprised of faculty, staff, students, and alumni, and thus represents and serves the interest of the entire Rutgers University community;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate hereby directs the President of Rutgers University to reject the "Compact for Excellence in Higher Education" along with all current or future offers of preferential treatment by the federal government in exchange for accommodations or other concessions that would limit academic freedom or institutional integrity.
